Dear New Year 6 Parents,

Year 6 Bring Your Own Device Programme (BYOD)

At DCSPD, we have a 'Bring Your Own Device' (BYOD) programme in Year 6.

As the advancement of technology in our society continues to develop at an unprecedented pace, device ownership in Year 6 provides a range of benefits to our learners:

- Empowered learning ownership at home and at school.
- Easier access to collaborative tasks with peers outside of school.
- A guided approach to device ownership in a classroom setting to better prepare students for the transition to Senior School.

What does this programme mean for my child?

Your child will need to have their own 2-in-1 hybrid device. This information is being communicated now to give new parents time to plan for their purchase before the start of the academic year.

What device and accessories should I purchase for my child?

Attached is a detailed guide specifying our minimum device requirements and accessories for the Year 6 BYOD programme.

The device should be a 2-in-1 laptop & tablet model with inking (writing) capabilities, front and rear-facing cameras and a stylus pen. This will allow students maximum flexibility to access all learning experiences, eg. filming, programming and inking (writing) directly into software such as Microsoft OneNote.

We highly recommend a Microsoft Windows device, as our IT department are able to offer specialized support.

Our IT team will be able to install all of the required software, including Qustodio, which is monitoring software for parents.

Where will the device be stored at school?

Your child's laptop will be stored in a special cabinet which will be housed in each home classroom. This will ensure that their device is safe and secure throughout the school day.

What support will be available for the students and parents?

The following will be provided on an ongoing basis:

- Resources and guides on Firefly
- Computer Science lessons on device ownership, usage and responsibilities
- Online drop-in clinics for parents
- Face-to-face parent workshops for information on:
 - Digital Safety
 - How to manage your digital life

Does this mean students will be allowed to use their devices in break times and lunch?

Devices will be placed back into their cabinets during morning break time and lunch time unless they are being used with a member of staff for a specific planned purpose. Year 6 students are always supervised when using technology.
