# INTRODUCTION

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At Dulwich College Suzhou, the Co-Curricular Activity (CCA) programme covers all the activities that take place outside of the taught curriculum. We consider this to be an integral part of the students' journey, as it affords an opportunity for students to experience and deepen their interests and abilities in a wide range of areas.

The CCA programme not only serves to complement and extend learning from the classroom, but it also helps to develop student health and wellbeing. Through their active participation in the CCA programme, students will stretch boundaries and be exposed to new challenges and experiences, developing the cognitive, social, and interpersonal skills necessary to succeed in this rapidly changing world.

Our CCA programme is a cohesive whole-College programme, from DUCKS through to the Senior School. The purpose of this is to ensure a link between all three schools, and to provide an opportunity for development and growth in student learning right from the early years. This also serves as a useful foundation in ensuring our students have continuity of relevant experiences to not only support their future university aspirations, but also to create well-balanced applications.

There are 3 components to the College CCA programme: Enrichment; The Arts; and Sport. The **Enrichment** focus consists of a range of academic Societies that reflect students' key learning areas. Some examples of the Societies being offered is a Science Society, a Debating Society, and a Technology Society. Participating in a Society provides students with opportunities to explore more diverse topics than the prescribed curriculum. Junior School students can also participate in additional Special Interest Clubs that don't fall within the realm of a Society, but still provide students with the opportunity to engage in a specific area of learning.

**The Arts** is another aspect to the CCA programme. The Arts includes Music, Art, Dance and Drama, providing an opportunity for students to engage in activities involving skill and imagination.

**Sport** is also a core component of the CCA programme, offering students a broad range of activities to participate in. The Sport programme allows for flexibility and student choice between Sport, Enrichment, and The Arts.

Please note: for sport related clubs after 4:30pm such as Swimming and Football, our coaches will reach out to families directly by Schools buddy emails.

## CCA 'View Only' Period

In addition to the details in this handbook, all the CCAs will be available to view on SchoolsBuddy during the Christmas Holiday. This will allow sufficient time for families to review the structure of the system and discuss CCA options.

## CCA Sign-up/Registration Period

CCAs will be available for families to register for in SchoolsBuddy during the following period:

- Open: 7:00pm on Wednesday 27 December 2023
- Close: 11:59pm on Wednesday 3 January 2024.

## Preference-based Booking

For preference-based booking, rather than 'first come first served', students may choose:

- up to five (5) CCAs they would like to attend across the week for all before school activities
- up to five (5) CCAs across the week for any lunch-time activities
- and up to five (5) CCAs across the week for after school activities.

For example, if a student is wishing to attend an after school CCA on Tuesday afternoon, Wednesday afternoon and Thursday afternoon, they will be required to choose the order of preference for each afternoon e.g. Wednesday's after school CCA may be preference number 1, Tuesday's after school CCA may be preference number 2, and Thursday's after school CCA may be preference number 3.

- DUCKS - Tuesday afternoon for Key Stage1, class-time CCAs will be arranged directly through DUCKS between the students and their teacher, not via SchoolsBuddy
- Junior School - Students register in SchoolsBuddy
- Senior School - Students register in SchoolsBuddy.

Please note:

If your child was allocated their 1st preference at the commencement of Term 1 for JS/SS Music, JS/SS Drama, or a Senior School Society, they are not required to re-register for their CCA in Term 2 or Term 3. If they wish to apply for any other CCA(s), they will need to register for this.

The College will evaluate all choices before allocating students their CCA/s. This may mean that whilst students may not get their first choice, they are likely to be involved in a CCA of their subsequent choosing. We hope that a preference-based booking process will remove the pressure to sign-up quickly.



### Email Notification of Preferences

- Families will receive an initial SchoolsBuddy generated email following their selection of preferences which will provide acknowledgement of the CCA/s their child/ren have applied for – this is not a confirmation email that your child/ren has been successfully placed into their preferred CCA/s.
- Once the registration period closes, families will receive a follow-up SchoolsBuddy generated email/s advising which CCA/s their child/ren was allocated/not allocated to.

### Fee-based CCA Payment

For the CCAs that are run by an external provider there is an associated cost. In this handbook, these CCAs are labelled with a yellow dot and the word “Cost” next to the title of the CCA. In SchoolsBuddy, you will see the word “Cost” next to the CCA title. Payment for such CCAs will be requested upon successful allocation to the CCA programme via a QR code which will be sent to you through SchoolsBuddy. If we do not receive payment within one week of sending the code, we reserve the right to remove the student from the CCA.

### Refunds

For any events that are organised by Dulwich College Suzhou and may impact upon paid externally-run CCAs, the College will provide a refund to parents based on the impacted dates. In other cases, whereby a student does not feel like attending his/her CCA for that day; is unable to attend due to an appointment or personal illness; for example, the College is not able to provide a refund. In cases of extenuating circumstances, such as bereavement, which prevent a student from attending school, the College will provide a refund on a case-by-case basis. ### CCAs by Audition (Music) or Selection (Sport)

There are some Music CCAs and Sport CCAs that have an entry requirement. For example, some Music CCAs require a student to audition before they may join. This is to ensure that the student is at the appropriate level on their instrument and is able to access the repertoire that is covered (if a student however is not successful in their audition, they are strongly encouraged to practice their instrument and retry the following term). Participation into such Music CCAs and Sport CCAs are determined by the CCA lead coordinator.

In this handbook:

- any Music CCAs that require a student to audition are labelled with the word “AUDITION”. In SchoolsBuddy, you will see the word “AUDITION” next to the CCA title.
- any Sport CCAs that have an entry requirement are labelled with a blue dot and the words “Selection”. In SchoolsBuddy, you will see the words “Selection” next to the CCA title.

Whilst we appreciate that this does preclude some students from joining these activities, the purpose is to ensure that we have a healthy mix of both competitive and inclusive CCAs in the College. If your child trialed for any such Sport CCAs and was selected, please register them for the CCA. If your child did not trial or was unsuccessful during selection, please do not register them for the CCA.

### Full Year Commitment in Music and Drama

Due to the nature of the Music and Drama events calendar, all JS/SS Music CCAs and all JS/SS Drama/Production CCAs require a year-long commitment by students. This is to support students in developing their musicianship and theatrical skills to be best prepared for College performances.

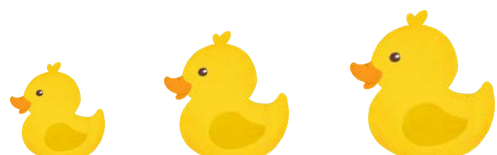


# DUCKS



In DUCKS, a holistic approach is encouraged in the early years' education, providing as many opportunities as possible for children to spark new interests and curiosities. All DUCKS staff plan and run CCAs each Tuesday afternoon for Key Stage 1 students. These activities form part of the students' curriculum. They also provide an experiential learning experience across the Enrichment, The Arts, and Sport programmes.

Through promoting student agency in DUCKS, children choose the CCA they wish to participate in which should be a different activity each time. The DUCKS CCAs are cyclical and can commence/finish mid-term. Therefore, students will get to choose from a number of different activities four times per year - these are listed below. If you have any questions regarding the Friday morning DUCKS CCA programme, please direct these to your child's class teacher.



## Student Leaders



Each Term, our student leaders are appointed by their peers to represent their class at a whole school level. As part of the College's promotion of student agency, student leaders will have an opportunity to share the things that really matter to them and their friends, helping to make DUCKS even better. Students in leadership positions will also have special duties and responsibilities throughout the week.

## Green Tigers



Are you a budding "eco-warrior", thinking about ways to save water and energy, or how to be more sustainable at home and at school? If so, Green Tigers will give you this opportunity. In this CCA, you will learn the importance of protecting the environment, as well as engage with a number of projects focused on sustainability.



## Digital Champions



Do you love technology and enjoy helping people? Do you know how to fix problems on computers or iPads, and want to learn more? Are you keen to try coding and learn about how cool machines work? If this is your passion, then come and join Digital Champions. You will be helping all of DUCKS as digital leaders - how cool!

## SE21



SE21 is a CCA based on the STEAM subjects: Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts and Mathematics. Do you love problem solving and investigating new things? Do you love mathematical games, exciting science, and making cool things? If so, this is the CCA for you!



## Ball Games



Our exciting Ball Games CCA involves a range of different ball games for everyone to enjoy. You will learn the key techniques of each different game and tactics on how to win. This will include skills for tennis, football, basketball, and more! You will also acquire the skills of teamwork and sportsmanship; strength; hand-eye coordination; and particular sport and position-specific skills.

## Let's Get Creative



Are you creative? Do you love cartoons? Would you love to make your own cartoons and create other cool art? Learn how real cartoon illustrators make their drawings step-by-step, and create your own cute and crazy characters. This is a great CCA to release your creativity and let your imagination run wild! It will help to build your fine motor skills, too.



## Dance



We love seeing children enjoy funky music, being active, and making friends. Our dance club encourages confidence through movement and music while having fun and learning the coolest dance moves. It's a great opportunity to really enjoy dance through a healthy mix of structured activities and creative games!

## Yoga and Mindfulness



This CCA will help to develop your balance and core strength skills through dynamic, sequenced movements and activities. You will also work on your focus and emotional regulation, using mindfulness techniques, such as Yoga Nidra.

## Cooking



Take a culinary tour around the world as a member of our DUCKS Cooking CCA. You will have the opportunity to learn about different food groups, and how these affect our bodies. We will discuss making healthy food decisions and get to cook some delicious dishes - yum!

## Emoji Club



The CCA will help students identify their emotions and physical cues when they arise. By learning 'magic' to find their own Emoji toolbox to express their emotions, we will explore emotional regulation and the related issue of expressing feelings. Additionally, we will introduce tools to manage them more successfully





# Enrichment



The Enrichment component of the CCA offering is a fundamental element of our approach to holistic education, as it recognises that whilst academic interests often begin in the classroom it is outside of that setting that enthusiasm of interests and ideas is turned into a life-long passion.

To ensure that students have access to a diverse range of ideas and experiences within a particular field, we have created Societies which encompass many similar clubs and projects, rather than be restricted by a discrete club structure. Teachers will work together with all students to develop a bespoke learning pathway that stretches all participants academically. In the academic Societies, students will have the opportunity to investigate subject areas beyond what the standard curriculum will allow, and work with fellow students from different year groups who share similar interests. We will continue however to offer Special Interest Clubs for Junior School students, so they can feel that their non-curricular interests are being supported.

In recognition of the fact that our students are at very different stages of their development, we have created the following structure for the Enrichment offerings:

- Experiment (DS) - DUCKS students will regularly change their CCA choices, so they have the chance to experiment with a range of new ideas and interests
- Development (JS) - As many Junior School students will have an interest area which is subject to change, they will have the flexibility to select new CCAs each term. This will give them the chance to develop their interest in a particular Society and/or Special Interest Club, whilst providing them opportunities to engage with new ideas
- Extension (SS) - By the time students reach Senior School they have a good idea of their interests. We want them to deepen and extend their learning within a chosen Society (CCA) and be able to demonstrate true commitment. Hence, Senior School students make a year-long commitment to their Society. We understand however that students may have a change of mind. Therefore, students will have access to a 2 week 'cooling off' period at the commencement of Term 1. After this, if a student decides they no longer wish to be in their chosen Society they may discuss this with the Coordinator of their Society. Approval to be removed from a Society must come from the relevant Deputy Head.

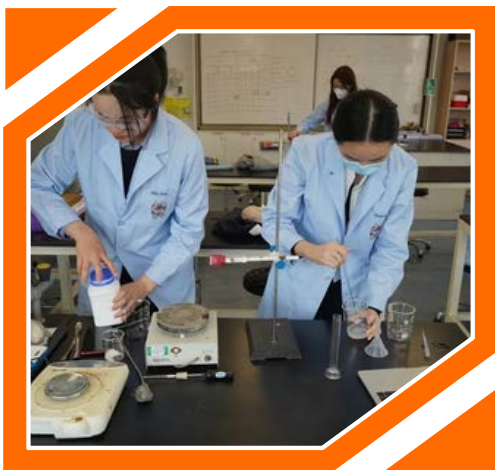

Chemistry Competition Club is for current Y11 and Y12 students, who are interested in participating The Cambridge Chemistry Challenge (C3L6), UK Chemistry Olympiad (UKChO) or Canadian Chemistry Contest (CCC). C3L6 is a highly valued chemistry challenge for UK high schools, with over 10,000 students participating each year, and is often used as a pre-test for the UKChO. It is aimed at high school students up to Year 12 and designed to extend chemistry knowledge in a challenging but fun way. UKChO is chemistry competition held by Royal Society of Chemistry. The problems in the UK Chemistry Olympiad often stimulate a lot of debate, raising awareness of what chemistry is all about. It provides a great opportunity for the students to develop and showcase some of the skills they'll need at university and beyond. From this year, we would like more students to win prizes. CCC is the Canadian version of C3L6; the winner of CCC has the opportunity to be invited to the Canadian Chemistry Olympiad (CCO). You will work together under teachers help to solve interesting chemistry questions and learn more skills and knowledges in Chemistry. 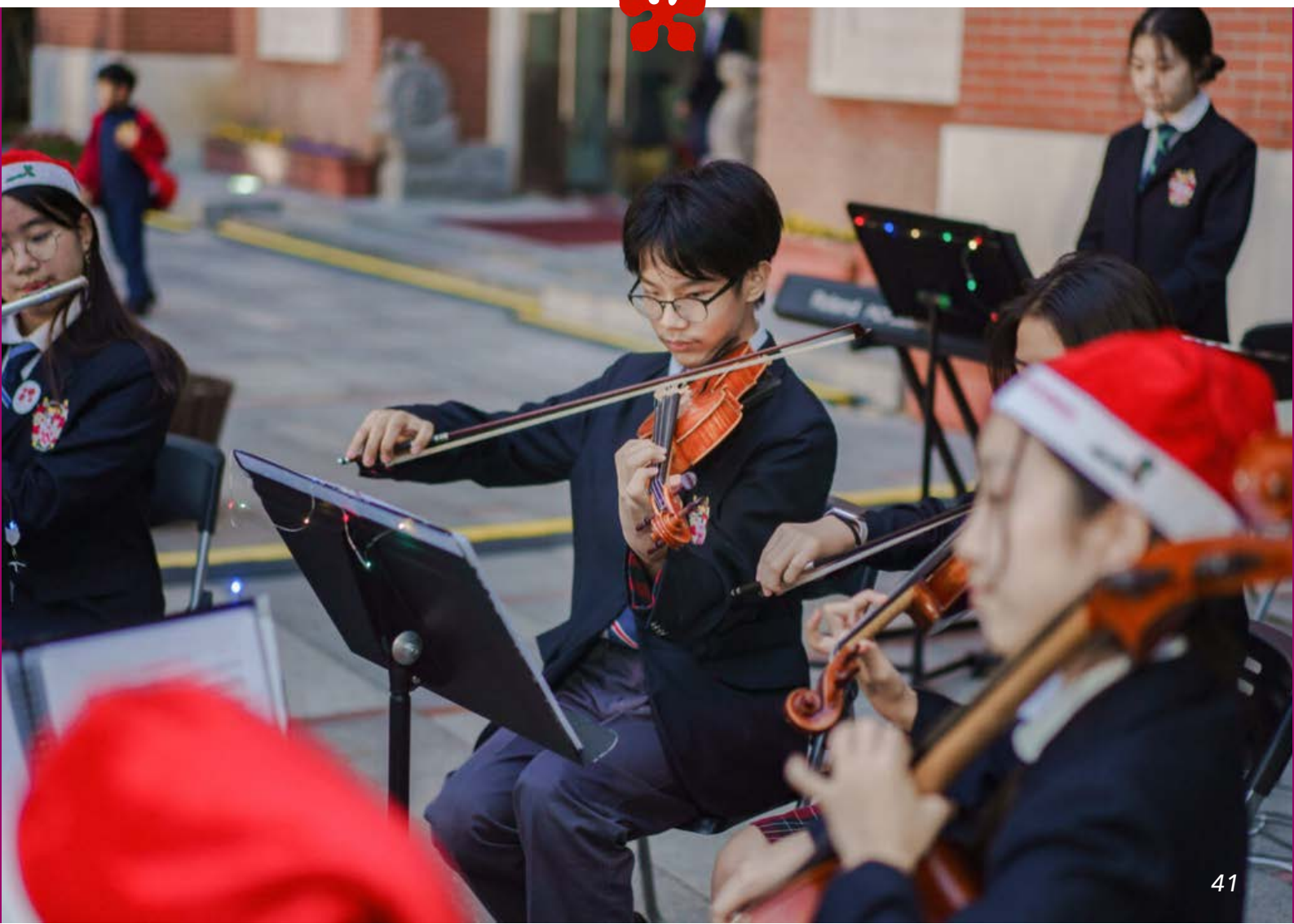
