# **PROLOGUE**

# THE DESTRUCTION OF TROY

Scene 1

Anthena entreats Zeus to free Odysseus from the clutches of ocean Nyripi, Calypso. He constructs a raft nearing to flee, near Phaecia. Poseidon intervenes with a fierce storm. Saved by Athena, Odysseus reaches Phaecia, recounting the saga of Troy's downfall to King Alcinous.

Scene 1A

Odysseus' fleet, driven by fate, sets sail for the land of the Cicones, where they wreak further havoc and plunder the island. Subsequently, a tumultuous storm propels Odysseus' ships to the land of the Cyclops, marking another fateful turn in their journey.

Scene 2

Twelve men, including Odysseus, come upon the empty hut of the Shepherd of Polyphemus. They stay to eat his cheese, waiting for his return to demand a gift. However, Polyphemus returns and instead of giving a gift, he eats two of Odysseus' men.

Scene 3

As the fleet nears home, Odysseus' men, driven by greed, open a bag they believe holds hidden gold, causing the ships to be propelled back to the island of Laestrygonia. Here, they encounter cannibal Giants, resulting in the loss of two ships. Only Odysseus's ship finds refuge on the island of Aeaea, home to the Witch-Goddess Circe.

Scene 4

Circe transforms Odysseus' men into pigs, but with Hermes' help, Odysseus saves them and they return to human form. Odysseus becomes Circe's lover, enjoying a period of happiness before his men express a desire to return home. Circe advises Odysseus to seek guidance from the blind Prophet Teiresias in Hades. That night, one crew member, Elpenor, falls to his death.

Odysseus and his men are pulled into the haunting underworld, where they navigate treacherous waters amidst eerie mist and echoing cries of lost souls. Odysseus, the steadfast leader, urges his men to stay strong as they face this unprecedented test of courage.

Scene 4B

After descending into the underworld, Odysseus meets Elpenor, who asks for a proper burial. He then consults Teiresias, who warns him of future trials. He reunites with his mother, Anticlea, learning of his family's hardships. These encounters deepen Odysseus' understanding of his journey.

As Circe recounts the perils awaiting Odysseus on his journey home—from

the enchanting Sirens whose songs lure sailors to their doom, to the monstrous Six-Headed Scylla, and the treacherous whirlpool of Charybdis— Odysseus and his men finally reach the island of the Sun God, Helios. The air is thick with anticipation and anxiety as they approach this final leg of their odyssey, knowing that the challenges ahead will test their courage and resolve, like never before.

Marooned and starving, Odysseus' men defy Teiresias' warning and consume the forbidden cattle of Helios. Enraged, Helios appeals to Zeus for justice. As the men set sail, Zeus summons a violent storm that sinks their final ship, resulting in the death of all of Odysseus' men.

Scene 6

Odysseus survives being swept back to Charybdis, barely escaping its whirlpool, only to be captured by Calypso. After Odysseus finishes recounting his tale to King Alcinous, he is given a ship and finally arrives in

Scene 7	Athena disguises Odysseus as a beggar, and he reunites with his son, Telemachus. Athena then transforms Odysseus back into his younger self, allowing Telemachus to recognize him. Together, they plan to defeat the Suitors by hiding weapons in the house. Disguised as the beggar, Telemachus brings Odysseus to meet the Suitors, who abuse and beat him. Scene 8	Spurred by Athena and losing hope of Odysseus' return, Penelope announces she will marry the suitor who can string Odysseus' bow and shoot an arrow through twelve axes. None succeed. Odysseus, disguised as a beggar, effortlessly strings the bow and shoots the arrow through the axes. Dulwich College Shanghai Pudong
Scene 9	Odysseus shoots a suitor and reveals his true identity, sparking a battle. With Athena's help, Odysseus and Telemachus defeat the remaining suitors. Penelope, who has been unaware of the fight, comes down to see her husband. Initially unsure, she tests him by ordering their bed to be moved, which prompts Odysseus to reveal the tale of its construction. Convinced by his story, Penelope joyfully reunites with her husband. Scene 10	The suitors' families seek revenge against Odysseus. They start a fight, but Athena intervenes, stopping the violence and causing the families to forget the massacre. This allows them to recognize Odysseus as their king, bringing peace to Ithaca.  Dulwich International High School Zhuhai
Epilogue	The scene opens with a promising conclusion, abruptly interrupted by the gradual, haunting entrance of the veiled Trojan Women, captivating Odysseus and his companions. As they reflect on their journey, it becomes evident that they are trapped in a relentless cycle of conflict and loss. They are deeply affected by the violence and suffering they have caused, yet feel powerless to stop it. Despite Athena's desperate attempts to intervene, each effort proves futile as the cycle stubbornly repeats. However, with each iteration, another fearless, strong female character joins Athena, ultimately breaking the cycle. This scene prompts us to ponder: How can we truly bring an end to war? How can we escape the cycle of repeating our past mistakes?  Full Company
