OUR SCHOOL

Dulwich College (Singapore) opened in 2014 and educates children from age 2 to 18. Our school serves 2,600 students from 48 different countries. There are over 1000 students in our Senior School, Years 7-13, 47 of which are in the graduating class of 2021. The primary teaching language of DCSG is English. Up to age 5, students follow the Early Years Foundation Stage, and from Years 1 to 8, they follow the National Curriculum of England and Wales, which is enhanced to meet the needs of our international student body.

For Years 9-11 DCSG offers a 3-year IGCSE programme, which allows us to teach beyond the curriculum whilst giving us the flexibility to explore deeper and broader learning. It encourages greater understanding and knowledge. In addition, the programme provides Global Skills as a taught course and enrichment opportunities which culminate in the Dulwich Challenge Award, bronze silver and gold standards, modelled on the Duke of Edinburgh International Award.

SCHOOL CALENDAR COVID-19 UPDATE

The school year is 181 days, running from mid-August to mid-June. It is divided into three terms. Due to Covid-19, Class of 2021 students engaged in E-Learning for 2 months from 23rd March – June 2nd. Students then returned full-time to campus and were able to undertake their end of year assessments and exams that contributed to transcript grades. The Class of 2021 returned from the summer holiday on 20th August with full time face-to-face instruction. Access to external testing has also been on offer within Singapore.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Our College offers over 100 different activities in addition to drama, arts and sports programmes, such as Model United Nations, Student Council, Green Gardeners' and the Duke of Edinburgh International Award. Service programmes support a host of local projects, ranging from working with the elderly to the delivery of food parcels for those in need. Internationally, DCSG works as part of the United World Schools programme, supporting a remote village school in Cambodia. Our music programme performs internationally and has links with The Royal Shakespeare Company and our Performing Arts has strong connections with LAMDA, which include offering their examinations. For sport, students compete in a wide variety of sports locally and internationally with other international schools within both Singapore and in Asia.

GRADING

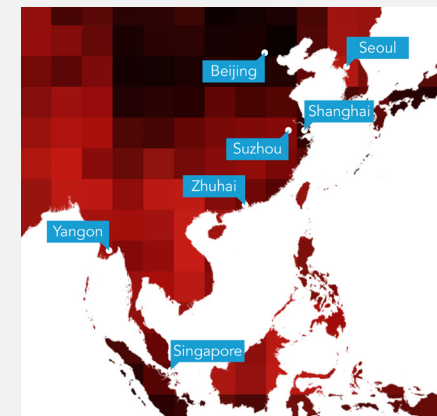

ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

IB Diploma Programme - Years 12 and 13 (Grades 11 and 12)

All DCSG students start the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) in Year 12 in preparation for university. Our first graduating class of 2020 with just 32 students matriculated to a diverse distribution of destinations spanning 6 countries: 56% UK; 16% Singapore National Service; 6% to each of Australia, USA and the Netherlands; and 3% to each of Italy and New Zealand. The remaining 3% elected for a Gap Year.

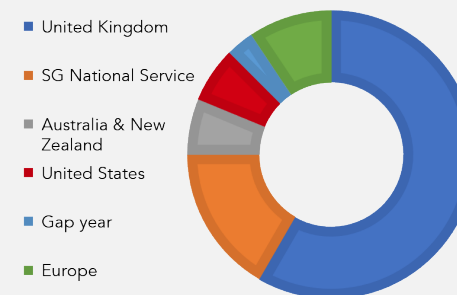
IGCSE - Years 10 and 11 (Grades 9 and 10)

Students take up to 11 individual examination subjects. All our students take Triple Award Science and are examined in each separate discipline. CIE grades are on a scale of A* to G, and EDEXCEL's new grading scale is 9-1, with a letter grade of U / 1 indicating a failure to meet minimum standards, as regulated by OFQUAL. A passing grade equivalent to a C on the new 9-1 scale is a 4, as indicated on the official website [www.pearsson.com](#). Within this framework the students are offered an accelerated IGCSE Maths programme which is examined at the end of Year 10. The enhanced IGCSE programme prepares students for the rigours of the 2-year International Baccalaureate programme in Years 12 and 13 (IBDP).
