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ABOUT DCB

Dulwich College Beijing opened in 2005 and is recognised as a leading international school in Beijing. Our College is a co-educational day school for students from Nursery to Year 13 (ages 3 to 18), with around 30 different nationalities represented in our community. Our diverse student body is filled with curious learners, analytical thinkers, and socially conscious individuals.

DCB combines a powerful academic tradition with an inclusive spirit and a warm, friendly environment. Our College is academically selective and follows an enhanced English National curriculum adapted for the needs of our international student body. Students in Years 10 and 11 study a curriculum that leads to IGSCE examinations and then follows the IB Diploma Programme in Years 12 and 13. Our strong academic curriculum is complemented by rich co-curricular activities.

The primary teaching language is English with a dual language approach in Mandarin and English for children aged 3 to 7. To ensure our students will thrive, we assess the level of English of nonnative speakers before making an offer. Our Mandarin programme is streamed and caters to all abilities.

ELIGIBILITY

Students wishing to enrol in the College must fall into one of the following categories as stipulated by the Beijing Municipal Education Commission (BMEC). Those who are unsure of eligibility are welcome to consult the DCB Admissions Office for further advice.

- Foreign passport holder with a valid Chinese visa or Travel Document.
- Hong Kong SAR, Macau SAR and Taiwan permanent resident with a valid Travel Permit (回乡 证 / 台胞证).
- Chinese passport holder with foreign permanent residence permit and proof of having lived abroad for more than one year.



ADMISSIONS CRITERIA

To succeed at Dulwich College Beijing students must be willing to work hard and be committed to our programme. Teachers provide the support necessary for students to become confident and independent learners. Additionally, we expect parents to support and be involved in their children's education.

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Applicants are admitted based on the:

- Ability to succeed socially and academically in the learning environment of Dulwich College Beijing
- Ability to demonstrate a good work ethic
- A history of school-appropriate behaviour
- A desire to attend Dulwich College Beijing
- Sense of community

The decision to offer a place to a prospective student is taken by the Admissions Committee, comprising the Head of School, the Admissions Department and, if relevant, the English Language and Additional Educational Needs Departments. Admission and year level placement are based on academic evaluations and assessments, English proficiency, past school records, student interviews, teacher recommendations, the birth date of the applicant and any diagnostic testing that will help the Admissions Committee understand any special learning needs an applicant may have.

ENTRY INTO YEAR 11 AND YEAR 13

- Applications for enrolment in Year 11 are considered on a case-by-case basis and are typically not considered for Term 2 and 3, as current students will be on study leave for mock exams and final exams for a significant portion of this period.
- The College will very rarely consider entry into Year 13. To be considered, students must be applying from a nearly identical IB programme and will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.



GUARDIANSHIP

In order to be considered for enrolment, a student must be living at the same residence in Beijing with one or more parents or with a legal guardian. The College reserves the right to refuse a candidate's application if we believe that the applicant is not/will not be living with parents or a legal guardian.

Year level placement is determined by an applicant's age as of 1st September in the academic year of entry. Applicants come from many different countries with varying school calendars and enrolment age practices. Our 1st September cut-off date and year level placement policy reflects what we believe to be the most appropriate alignment for academic and social readiness. An exception to this policy would require the approval of the Head of College and would only be made when all the evidence suggests it is in the child's best interest to be enrolled in a year other than what his/her age suggests.

CLASS SIZES

The maximum number of students in each class is as follows:

- Nursery up to 20 students
- Reception up to 20 students
- Year 1 to Year 11 up to 22 students
- IB Diploma (Years 12 and 13) 14 students

The College may increase the number of students in each class under special circumstances with approval from the Head of College.

APPLICATION PROCESS

A very warm welcome from the Admissions Team of Dulwich College Beijing! We understand that choosing a school for your child is a decision not made lightly and our admissions team is here to help support and guide you through the application process.

Students are admitted on a rolling basis, therefore applications are accepted for all 3 terms of each school year. Places are offered through a holistic review process to enthusiastic and talented applicants who look for the opportunity to reach their full potential as well as having an impact on our community.

REGISTER YOUR ACCOUNT

Begin your admission process by registering an account at our application portal on our website (beijing.dulwich.org). Once you are registered, you can log in to manage your enquiry and application at any time.

Please keep your login information handy and ensure your contact information is up to date, so we can send you updates about our school and invite you to future admissions events.

Your next step is to submit an online enquiry so we can assess your child's eligibility based on our eligibility criteria. If your child is eligible to apply, you'll be invited to submit an online application.

Submitting an enquiry also enables us to communicate with you throughout the application process and keep you informed of any news and upcoming admission events.

To determine which year to apply for your child, please refer to the Age Placement Chart on the previous page. As a general rule, students should have reached the age indicated in the chart before 1st September of the intended enrolment year.



Once you receive our invitation to apply, please login to your account from our application portal to fill out and upload all the required information. We highly recommend that you keep the documents in the below checklist handy before filling out the application and complete the form in one sitting which will take approximately 10 -15 minutes.

Please note that the application will be processed only when all the required fields are properly filled and all the supporting documents in the following checklist are uploaded.

To ensure that all information is relevant to the student we ask that you complete a separate form per child. If you apply for more than one child in your household, please submit their applications under one account as siblings.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS FOR COMPLETING THE ONLINE APPLICATION (SCANNED COPY)

- Valid ID of each parent/guardian
- Valid ID of the applicant (whichever is applicable)
 - o Foreign passport and valid Chinese visa or Travel Document
 - o Hong Kong SAR / Macau SAR / Taiwan passport with a valid Travel Permit
 - o Hong Kong SAR / Macau SAR permanent resident card
 - o Chinese passport with a foreign permanent residence permit and proof of having lived abroad for more than one year
- Applicant's Birth Certificate
- Official school reports from the last two school years in English, or verifiable English translation
- Current childhood Vaccination/Immunisation Record
- Applicant's coloured ID photo in .jpeg/.jpg format (max. size 1MB)
- Supporting documents of individualised testing (Optional)

RETURNING STUDENTS

Applicants who were enrolled at DCB for one term or more before will be treated as new applicants and required to go through the entire application process.

ASSESSMENTS AND INTERVIEWS

After receiving your completed application form and all the supporting documents, we'll conduct an initial review of the applicant's profile. Arrangements will then be made for the appropriate assessments and interviews to be conducted.

Qualified applicants will be invited for in-person assessments and interviews. Remote assessments and interviews can only be arranged for applicants residing overseas or in other cities. We will send you the instructions and how to pay the application fee of RMB 2,500 before the assessments and interviews can be arranged. The application fee is non-refundable and non-transferable.

Applicants do not need to do any preparation for the assessments because they are meant to assess each applicant's aptitude rather than knowledge acquisition. Overseas candidates can be assessed at their current school. Assessment scores are not disclosed to parents.

 - o Interviews

APPLICATION REVIEW AND DECISION

After admissions assessments have been completed, the student's application will be reviewed and parents will be informed of the decision. The admission decision is taken by the Admissions Committee, comprising the Head of School, the Admissions Department, the Head of Key Stage (for Senior School candidates only), and if relevant, the English Language and Additional Educational Needs Departments.

As a school that values diversity and is focused on whole-person education, our Admissions Committee takes a holistic approach when reviewing each application. The admissions decision will be made not just based on the applicant's academic performance but also on fit and his/ her potential of becoming an engaged member of the DCB community. Students deemed able to succeed academically, socially, and emotionally will be accepted based on the placements available.

The final admission decision will be communicated to the applicant's parents through email. All applicants shall reply in writing whether they accept/reject the offer. Please note that we do not share entrance assessment results with parents.

OFFER OF PLACE OR WAITING LIST

Successful candidates will be offered a place or, if there are no available spaces, or the application is for a future academic year, be placed on a waiting list. It is in the applicant's best interest to complete the admissions process quickly to ensure the earliest possible decision and position on the waiting list. Waiting list positions are not disclosed to parents.

Waiting lists are maintained for one academic year only. Parents of candidates need to inform DCB Admissions whether they wish to re-apply for the following academic year. The latest supporting documents and application fees will be required for such cases.

*DCB has the right to revoke an offer that has been made at any point if they have been made aware of any additional information that could affect the candidate meeting the College's entry requirements.

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DECLINED

If the Admissions Committee chooses not to offer an applicant a place at DCB, this could be due to the fact that the applicant has shown through the assessment process that they are unable to meet our entry requirements and/or that he/she is not a good fit. Declined applicants will be allowed to re-sit the assessment if they choose to re-apply for the following academic year. DCB is not under any obligation to release the results of the assessment tests and interviews.

DEFERRAL AND NON-ACCEPTANCE OF OFFER

If the applicant wishes to defer his/her place at DCB after an offer has been made, the applicant's place will not be guaranteed and will be subject to reassessment and availability.

If the applicant chooses not to accept the offer, his/her place will be immediately released and offered to the next qualified candidate on the waiting list.

All applicants who wish to defer or reject the offer shall email DCB Admissions Office (admissions. beijing@dulwich.org) about their decision before the deadline as required in the Offer Letter. If they would like to re-apply to DCB in the future, they will be treated as new applicants and required to go through the entire application process and pay the application fee.



PAYMENT OF PLACEMENT DEPOSIT AND TUITION FEE

Applicants accepted for admission will receive an invoice following the acceptance of the Offer Letter. Parents are required to confirm their intention and pay a refundable placement deposit of RMB 18,000 and tuition fee (subject to Terms and Conditions). If payment is not made by the date specified in the invoice, the applicant's place will be forfeited and may be given to another candidate. No student will be allowed to attend class until his or her tuition and placement deposit has been paid.



ENROLMENT

After the placement deposit and tuition fee are received by DCB, we will send onboarding information to guide you through the enrolment process.

AEN/EAL SUPPORT

ADDITIONAL EDUCATIONAL NEED (AEN)

Candidates with AENs are accepted to DCB on a case-by-case basis. The needs of the child are considered alongside current levels of staffing, expertise, and resources within the school.

We offer support that is tailored to fit the individual student, but in general ranges from individual education plans to support the curriculum in the classroom. We may withdraw students individually, withdraw them in groups or support them in class, depending on the most appropriate method for each student. Sometimes a student's progress is just monitored and reviewed at a later date. The AEN Department works with class teachers in adapting aspects of the curriculum for individual student's needs. We are also able to provide detailed information and teaching strategies for specific conditions.

Additional adult support or specialist resources may be necessary for the school to make adequate educational provisions for a student. The additional cost for this will be met by the parents. DCB will only admit those students who can be adequately supported, and this generally means supporting those with mild, as opposed to moderate or severe needs.

ENGLISH AS AN ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE (EAL)

Applicants who are being considered for admission and are identified as needing EAL support will be asked to undergo an EAL assessment. The purpose of the assessment is to further explore whether the candidate can access the English-based curriculum and whether the level of support needed fits within the level of staff support available.

Students who require additional English language assistance to access the curriculum successfully are provided with EAL support.

Our EAL specialists help students develop the skills necessary to complete their school work in English by working and planning with the student's class and subject teachers. Students who are not native English speakers, but who are fluent in English and have age-appropriate literacy skills in English, are not classified by DCB as EAL learners. To ensure a balanced and diverse student body, DCB reserves the right to limit:

• The enrolment of EAL students per class and year group.

• The enrolment of EAL students who share a mother tongue. DCB will only admit those students for whom it can make adequate provision of support.



SCHOOL UNIFORM

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All students except IB students (who adhere to a business dress code) are required to wear school uniforms. The school uniform is different for warm and cold weather, and students should adhere to seasonal requirements as outlined in the Uniform Guide. Uniform fees are borne by the parents.



SCHOOL LUNCH

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The school lunch programme provides students with a choice to either bring a lunch from home or choose to pay for the lunch provided by the School's caterer. A selection of different balanced set menus is available and will be served to students attending a full day of school (Nursery to Year 13).

All full-time students will be on an ID/Lunch Card system and will be charged as and when they have a school meal. The ID/Lunch Card can be topped up periodically to cover the costs of lunches or snacks purchased (price varies).

ADMISSIONS EVENTS

We host school tours and open days for prospective families on regular basis. Open Day provides a comprehensive introduction to DCB. You will have a chance to meet our Head of College, Head of School, faculty, admissions representatives, and student leaders and find out what it's like to learn at DCB.
