OUR SCHOOL

Dulwich College (Singapore) opened in 2014 and educates children from age 2 to 18. Our school serves 2,750 students from 55 different countries. There are over 1200 students in our Senior School, Years 7-13, 90 of which are in the graduating Class of 2022. The primary teaching language of DCSG is English. Up to age 5, students follow the Early Years Foundation Stage, and from Years 1 to 8, they follow the National Curriculum of England and Wales, which is enhanced to meet the needs of our international student body. For Years 9 – 11 DCSG offers a 3-year IGCSE programme, which allows us to teach beyond the curriculum whilst giving us the flexibility to explore deeper and broader learning. It encourages greater understanding and knowledge. In addition, the programme provides Global Skills as a taught course and enrichment opportunities which culminate in the Dulwich Challenge Award, bronze silver and gold standards, modelled on the Duke of Edinburgh International Award.

SCHOOL CALENDAR COVID-19 UPDATE

The school year is 181 days, running from mid-August to end of June. It is divided into three terms. Due to Covid-19, the Class of 2022 students engaged in E-Learning for 2 months in 2020 whilst studying their IGCSE programme. The school has been open for full time learning since June 2020, hence the Class of 2022 has had no disruption from face-to-face instruction, although strict Covid-19 restrictions have been in place within the school and Singapore, which has severely impacted on sports, CCA and CAS activities, with no competitive ACSIS sports league fixtures since early 2020. Access to external SAT / ACT testing with reduced capacity due to government Covid-19 regulations for schools has been on offer within Singapore.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Our College offers over 100 different activities in addition to drama, arts and sports programmes, such as Model United Nations, Student Council, Green Gardeners' and the Duke of Edinburgh International Award. Service programmes support a host of local projects, ranging from working with the elderly to the delivery of food parcels for those in need. Internationally, DCSG works as part of the United World Schools programme, supporting a remote village school in Cambodia. Our Performing Arts programme performs internationally and has connections with The Royal Shakespeare Company, Vienna Boys Choir, Manchester College of Music and LAMDA. For sport, in non-Covid times, students compete in a wide variety of sports locally and internationally with other international schools within both Singapore and in Asia.

GRADING

We do not rank our students or calculate grade point averages. For the duration of course work, student progress is internally assessed using pre-established, standards-based performance levels. Year 11 IGCSE courses and Year 13 IB conclude with externally assessed examinations.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

IGCSE - Years 10 and 11 (Grades 9 and 10)

For Years 9-11 DCSG offers a 3-year IGCSE programme, which allows us to teach beyond the curriculum whilst giving us the flexibility to explore deeper and broader learning. It encourages greater understanding and knowledge. In addition, the programme provides Global Skills as a taught course and enrichment opportunities which culminate in the Dulwich Challenge Award, bronze silver and gold standards, modelled on the Duke of Edinburgh International Award. Students take up to 11 individual examination subjects. All our students take separate science and are examined in each separate discipline. CAIE grades are on a scale of A* to G, and EDEXCEL's new grading scale is 9-1, with a letter grade of U / 1 indicating a failure to meet minimum standards, as regulated by OFQUAL. A passing grade equivalent to a C on the new 9-1 scale is a 4, as indicated on the official website www.pearson.com. Some students can study IGCSE 'Additional Mathematics' as an option choice. The enhanced IGCSE programme prepares students for the rigours of the 2-year International Baccalaureate Programme in Years 12 and 13 (IBDP).

IB Diploma Programme - Years 12 and 13 (Grades 11 and 12)

All DCSG students start the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) or the IBCP Courses route in Year 12 in preparation for university. Our second graduating Class of 2021 with just 47 students matriculated to a diverse distribution of destinations spanning 9 countries: 43% UK; 23% Singapore, of which 15% were National Service men; 9% to Canada, 6% USA, 4% to Australia, and 2% to Netherlands, Malta, Switzerland, and Hong Kong. The remaining 6% elected for a Gap Year.

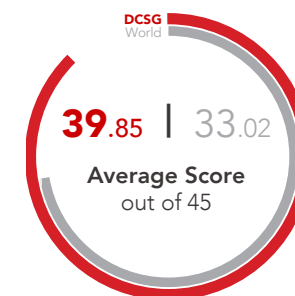
2021 IB DIPLOMA RESULTS
