



Curatorial Rationale

The central theme of my exhibition is circled around influence of technology, the inspiration comes from a documentary which is about big data, that reminds me nowadays how we are influenced by this technical age. The order of my exhibition is based on how corrosive electronic devices are to our lives.

In my exhibition space, In the middle is my heart installation – yrettabfoyuonur (don't run out of battery), just as the way I positioned it, it played a huge role in our body. as it's the core of a person. It's just like the name - Don't run out of battery. Since we have become more dependent on our phones than we expected. The cell phone in the infusion bag is like a nutrient solution, providing blood and nutrients to our heart, It keeps us alive. It's like we can't live without our phones. I want to let the viewer feel attached, so they can start think more deeply of this issue. This is also like a division of the two issue. At the left side of the heart installation is my reflection of this information explosion era. In the corner is the fashion piece – the untold. I put it in the corner because it's just like its name - the untold. People tend to overlook things in inconspicuous places like corners, like the 'truth' hidden in this information age that people ignored. Then followed by the clay – untitled, which is identity brought about by the noise of information, and in this era when everyone can free speech, many people will also receive bad speech about themselves, resulting in the final identity of whether it is job, age, gender, or social status, or love. This information comes from everywhere. Next, there is the confusion caused by the diversity of information. People gradually lose their ability to think deeply because of the convenience brought by technology.

At the right side of the heart installation is my reflection of the addiction to technology. In the corner is the fashion piece – addicted. This piece is inspired by a stranger I see on the road. A little girl is crying and her mum didn't comfort her, instead her mum was looking at the phone. This reminds me how we were like nowadays. The invention of phone is to keep us in close contact, however this has end up make us far apart from each other. This is an issue that is everywhere, but haven't been discovered by people. Followed by this is the photograph piece – control, When we think that technology devices are just tools, we don't realize that we have become tools of electronics. We are like puppets in a shadow play, controlled by technology. Due to this addiction of technology, we don't go out or look up at the sky anymore, since phone seems more attracting to us. Therefore my painting – command c is placed next to the heart installation. As people are mainly into social media on phone. They ignore the view of the outside world.

I was interested in capturing the negative influence of technology have on our interaction. This piece is influenced by Kamil Kotarba. Hands and technology screen are a key feature. The untold

Fashion, photograph Size 19L x 80cm December 2021

This piece is called 'the untold', which is showing my reflection to this era of information explosion. The magnifying glass is representing you only see a small part of the information rather than a whole. The burned holes and the interweaved fabric symbolising the second hand information, where mixed by different sources. I also put some spare parts of wire on the resins. I try to make the audience feel attached.







Command C






Control
