OUR SCHOOL

Dulwich College (Singapore) opened in 2014 and educates children from age 2 to 18. Our school serves 2,726 students from over 50 different countries. There are over 1150 students in our Senior School, Years 7-13, with 124 being in the graduating Class of 2023. The primary teaching language of DCSG is English. Up to age 5, students follow the Early Years Foundation Stage, and from Years 1 to 8, they follow the National Curriculum of England and Wales, which is enhanced to meet the needs of our international student body. In Years 9-11 DCSG offers a 3-year IGCSE/GCSE programme. The extended length of the programme allows us to provide opportunities for subject-based enrichment, to teach beyond the curriculum and to explore deeper and broader learning. This enhanced IGCSE programme prepares students for the rigours of the 2-year International Baccalaureate Programme in Years 12 and 13 (IBDP). In addition, students are provided opportunities to take part in a range of co-curricular activities, recognised through the Dulwich Challenge Award, with three levels to this award: Dulwich Challenge, Dulwich Challenge Extra and Dulwich Challenge Elite. Furthermore, students are given the opportunity to take part in the International Award, modelled on the Duke of Edinburgh Award, bronze, silver and gold standards.

SCHOOL CALENDAR COVID-19 UPDATE

The school year is 181 days, running from mid-August to end of June. It is divided into three terms. In response to Covid-19, the Class of 2023 has had no disruption from face-to-face instruction, although strict Covid-19 restrictions have been in place within the school and Singapore, which has severely impacted on sports, CCA and CAS activities, with no competitive ACSIS sports league fixtures from February 2020 – April 2022. Access to external SAT / ACT testing with reduced capacity due to government Covid-19 regulations for schools has been on offer within Singapore AY 2021-2022.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Our College offers over 100 different activities such as Model United Nations, Student Council, Sustainability Matters and the International Award in addition to the drama, arts and sports programmes. Service programmes support a host of local projects, ranging from working with the elderly to the delivery of food parcels for those in need. Internationally, DCSG also works as part of the United World Schools programme, supporting a remote village school in Cambodia and in Indonesia 'Batam Build' via Habitat for Humanity. Our Performing Arts programme performs internationally and has connections with The Royal Shakespeare Company, Vienna Boys Choir, Manchester College of Music and LAMDA. For sport, students compete in a wide variety of sports locally and internationally with other international schools within both Singapore via the ACSIS sports league and in Asia. DCSG offers a dedicated 'IGNITE' pathway for identified highly talented students in the Performing Arts, Creative Arts, and Sport.

GRADING

We do not rank our students or calculate grade point averages. For the duration of course work, student progress is internally assessed using pre-established, standards-based performance levels. Year 11 IGCSE courses and Year 13 IB conclude with externally assessed examinations.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

IGCSE - Years 10 and 11 (Grades 9 and 10)

In Years 9-11 DCSG offers a 3-year IGCSE/GCSE programme. The extended length of the programme allows us to provide opportunities for subject-based enrichment, to teach beyond the curriculum and to explore deeper and broader learning. It encourages greater conceptual understanding, more in-depth knowledge and more sophisticated skills. In addition, all students study Global Skills, a taught course that lays a solid foundation of critical thinking, bring together elements of philosophy, current affairs, research methodologies and public speaking. Students take up to 11 externally assessed examination subjects. The exam boards used include Cambridge Assessment International Education (CAIE), Pearson Edexcel, AQA, Oxford AQA and CCEA. CAIE courses are graded on a scale of A* to G, while the other exam boards are graded on a scale of 9 to 1. A passing grade of C for CAIE is equivalent to a 4 for the other exam boards.

IB Diploma Programme - Years 12 and 13 (Grades 11 and 12)

All DCSG students start the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) or the IB Courses route in Year 12 in preparation for university. Our third graduating Class of 2022 with 90 students matriculated to a diverse distribution of destinations spanning 10 countries: 53% UK; 16% Singapore, (of which 13% were National Service men); 10% USA, 5% to Europe, 4% to Australia, and 2% to each of Canada and Hong Kong. The remaining 8% elected for a Gap Year.
