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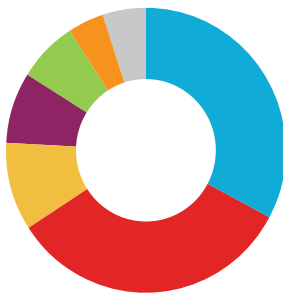

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Our School

Dulwich College Beijing (DCB) is an independent international school serving 1511 expatriate English-speaking students, of whom 85 are in the Class of 2019.

Our students come from over 40 countries and range in age from 1 to 18. Up to Year 9 (Grade 8) they follow the English National Curriculum, enhanced to meet the needs of our international student body. In Years 10 and 11 (Grades 9 and 10) they follow the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE), a two-year course culminating in externally assessed examinations. In Years 12 and 13 (Grades 11 and 12) all our students enter the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP).

Since it opened its doors in 2005, DCB has been named British International School of the Year (2011) by the UK Independent Schools Awards. In 2017 the College won a British International School Award for Teaching Initiative and a Corporate Social Responsibility Award and its graduating classes have achieved IB results that place the school among the world's best.

English is our language of instruction and all our students speak fluent English.

The Dulwich Network

DCB is one of ten international schools in Asia that operate in partnership with the 400 year-old founding school, Dulwich College in London under the World Charter and together they make up Dulwich College International (DCI). Dulwich College in London inspects DCB and each Dulwich international school annually.

School Calendar

The school year is 181 days, running from mid-August to mid-June. It is divided into three terms.

Grading

We do not rank our students or calculate grade point averages. For the duration of course work, student progress is internally assessed each term using pre-established, standards-based performance levels. Courses conclude with externally assessed examinations.

Discipline Policy

DCB reports all out-of-school suspensions, exclusions and withdrawals that arise as a result of a disciplinary incident that raises significant concerns about academic integrity or wellbeing of self or others.

Co-curricular Activities

Our students are encouraged to participate in activities that build team and leadership skills, such as Model United Nations (MUN), Beijing Model United Nations (BEIMUN), Debate, Interact Charities, Student Council, Masters in Technology, Migrant Children's Foundation, the Duke of Edinburgh International Award in addition to a sports programme at both varsity and junior varsity level where students compete in conference play with international schools in Asia.

Academic Programmes

IGCSE – Years 10 and 11 (Grades 9 and 10)

Students take up to 11 individual examination subjects in the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) course. The majority of our students also study an accelerated mathematics programme.

All students may choose Double or Triple Award Science. While both options include physics, chemistry and biology, Triple Award Science is more rigorous.

Grades are on a scale of A* to G, with a letter grade of U indicating a failure to meet minimum standards.

Students also have the option of taking one of two specially designed, internally assessed courses. Our STEAM course delivers 21st century design and technology competencies through an interdisciplinary curriculum. Students also have the option of taking a humanities based liberal arts course that focuses on a wide range of disciplines from philosophy to film studies to the Classics.

IB Diploma Programme - Years 12 and 13 (Grades 11 and 12)

All DCB students start the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) in Year 12 (Grade 11) in preparation for university.

University Matriculations 2015 - 2018

We believe in helping students choose prospective colleges and universities based on "fit". For this reason, students are limited to 10 applications worldwide each academic year.
