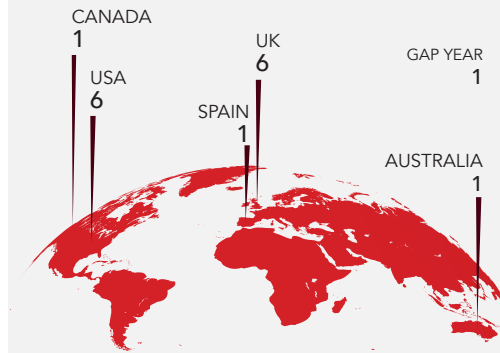

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OUR NETWORK DULWICH COLLEGE | INTERNATIONAL |



Dulwich College Seoul (DCSL) is one of ten international schools in Asia that operate in partnership with Dulwich College, our founding school in London, under the World Charter and together they make up Dulwich College International (DCI). Dulwich College inspects DCSL and each Dulwich international school annually.

OUR SCHOOL

Dulwich College Seoul (DCSL) is a British independent international school serving 694 expatriate English-speaking students, of whom 9 are in the Class of 2021. Up to Year 9 (Grade 8) they follow the English National Curriculum, enhanced to meet the needs of our international student body. In Years 10 and 11 (Grades 9 and 10) they follow the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE), a two-year course culminating in externally assessed examinations. In Years 12 and 13 (Grades 11 and 12) all our students enter and complete the IB Programme. English is our language of instruction and all our students speak fluent English.

SCHOOL CALENDAR COVID-19 UPDATE

The school year is 181 days, running from mid-August to mid-June. It is divided into three terms. Due to Covid-19, Class of 2020 and 2021 students engaged in E-Learning for [4] months from [late February– mid June of 2020]. During that time, students participated in a blended learning model that combined in-person and online asynchronous learning, dependent on the government's social distancing measures which were evaluated and modified every two weeks. For the Class of 2021, this meant that teachers also had to ensure that time and support was given to the non-negotiables of the IB Diploma Programme: Extended Essay preparation, the completion of Internal Assessments and continuation of CAS. Fortunately, this graduating class was able to sit End-of-Year examinations upon returning to campus in June. These results provided a useful indicator of student progress and were used in conjunction with a variety of other assessment data to accurately evaluate our students' academic performance. The Class of 2021 returned from the summer holiday on the 24th of August, however two days into the academic year, we were forced to close the campus and Year 13 students were required to work from home for two weeks. We face uncertainty around being able to provide face-to-face learning opportunities as we constantly face the threat of campus closure in response to national and local mandates.

There were no IGCSE or IB examinations in May/June 2020. At this time, it is uncertain whether the Class of 2021 will be able to sit external exams.

CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

Our College offers over 100 different activities in addition to drama, arts and sports programmes, such as Model United Nations, Student Council, Sustainability Club and the Duke of Edinburgh International Award. Students compete in sports at multiple levels against other international schools in Asia.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMMES

IGCSE - Years 10 and 11 (Grades 9 and 10)

Students take up to 10 individual examination subjects in the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) course. It is common for our students to study an accelerated mathematics and/or Chinese programme within the IGCSE. Students on an accelerated programme for mathematics receive an IGCSE Mathematics grade in Year 10 an IGCSE grade for Additional Mathematics in Year 11. Those on an accelerated Chinese programme receive a grade for Mandarin as a Foreign Language in Year 10 and a grade for Mandarin as a Second Language in Year 11. All of our students take IGCSE Coordinated Science. They study physics, chemistry and biology as separate subjects and are awarded one IGCSE grade (equivalent to two subjects). IGCSE grades are on a scale of A* to G for Cambridge subjects and 9 to 1 for Pearson subjects.

IB Diploma Programme - Years 12 and 13 (Grades 11 and 12)

All DCSL students start the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) in Year 12 (Grade 11) in preparation for university.

GRADING

We do not rank our students or calculate grade point averages. For the duration of course work, student progress is continuously assessed. DCSL reports triannually using pre-established, standards-based performance levels. Years 10 and 12 conclude with internally assessed exams while Years 11 and 13 conclude with externally assessed examinations.

DISCIPLINE POLICY

DCSL reports all out-of-school suspensions and exclusions that occur as a result of disciplinary incidents that raise significant concerns about a student's academic integrity or has a significant impact on the wellbeing of the student or others within the community.

We believe in helping students choose prospective colleges and universities based on 'fit'. For this reason, students are limited to 10 applications worldwide each academic year. Below are the universities and colleges to which DCSL students have been accepted. Matriculations are in **bold**.

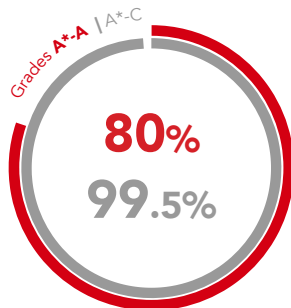
