Since we opened our doors in 2005, Dulwich College Beijing has been named British International School of the Year (2011) by the UK Independent Schools Awards. 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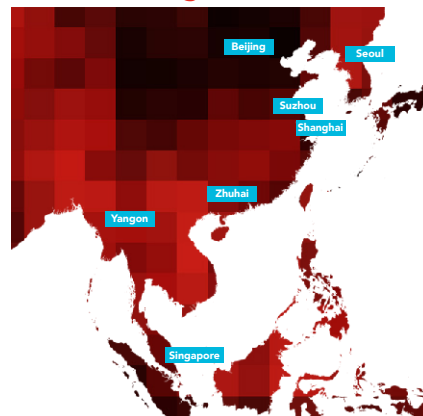

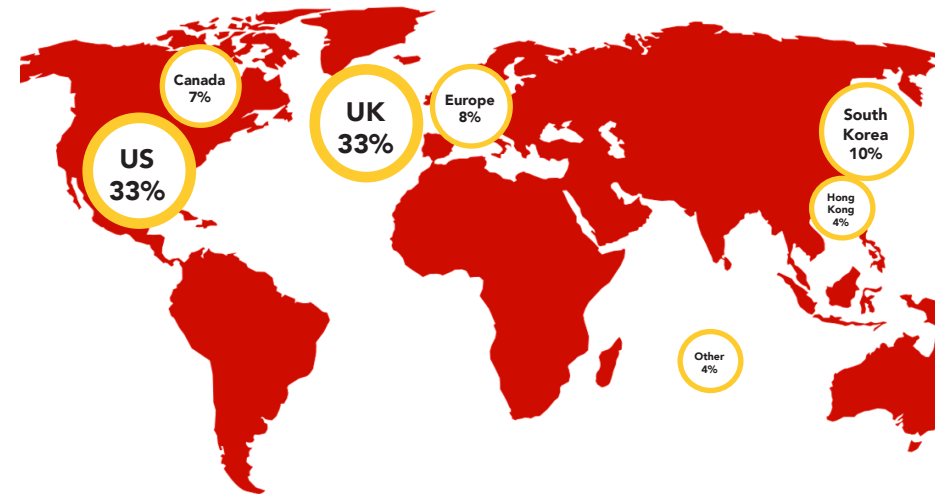

Our Academics

Overview

Our students come from over 40 countries and range in age from Toddler to 18. Up to Year 9 (Grade 8), we follow the English National Curriculum, enhanced to meet the needs of our international student body. In Years 10 and 11 (Grades 9 and 10), we follow the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE), a two-year course culminating in externally assessed examinations. In Years 12 and 13 (Grades 11 and 12), all students enter the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP).

IGCSE – Years 10 and 11 (Grades 9 and 10)

Students take up to 11 individual examination subjects in the International General Certificate of Secondary Education (IGCSE) course. The majority of our students also study an accelerated mathematics programme and enhanced Chinese instruction.

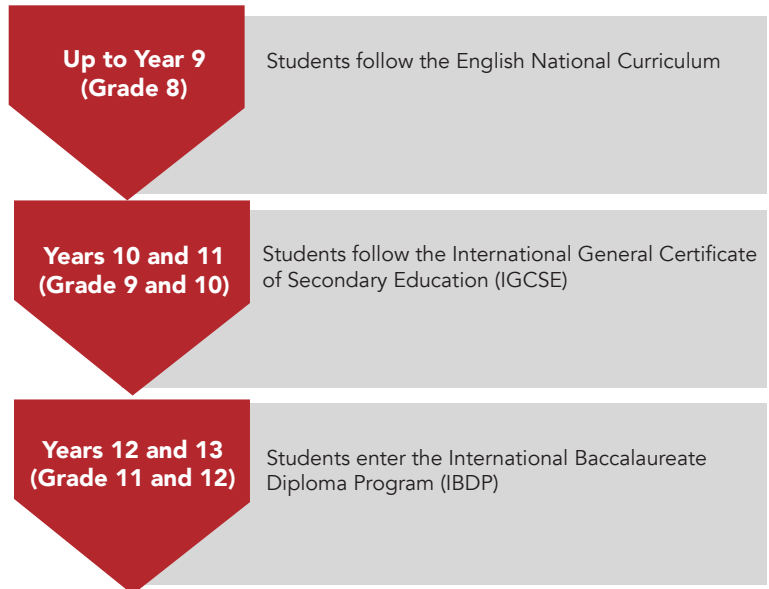
All students may choose Double or Triple Award Science. While both options include physics, chemistry and biology, Triple Award Science is more rigorous.

Grades are on a scale of A* to G and 9-1, with a letter grade of U indicating a failure to meet minimum standards.

Students also have the option of taking one of two specially designed, internally assessed courses. Our STEM course delivers 21st century design and technology competencies through an interdisciplinary curriculum. Students also have the option of taking a humanities-based, liberal arts course that focuses on a wide range of disciplines from philosophy to film studies to the classics.

IB Diploma Programme - Years 12 and 13 (Grades 11 and 12)

All DCB students start the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) in Year 12 (Grade 11) in preparation for university.



School Calendar and Grading

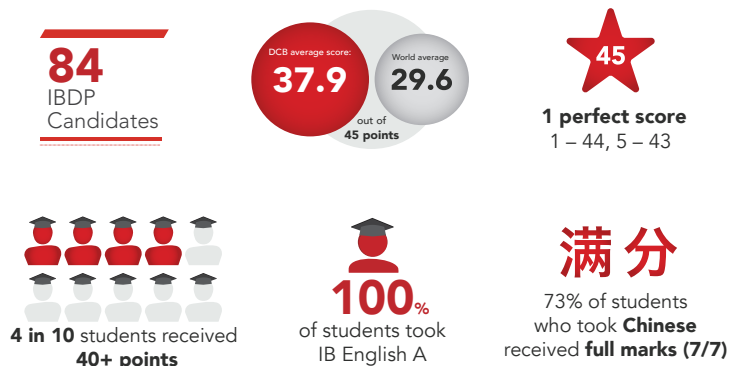
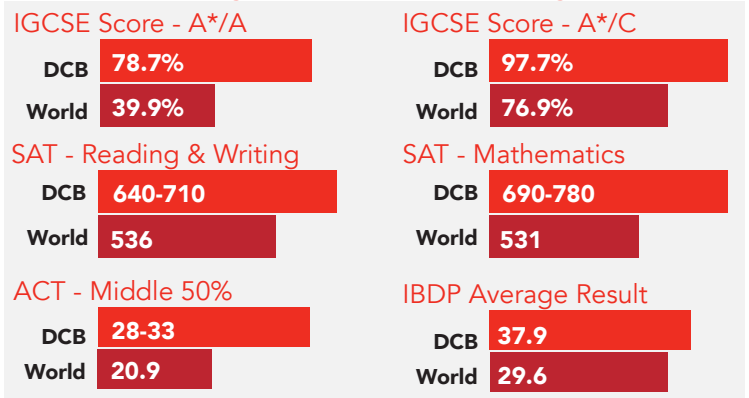
The school year is 181 days, running from mid-August to mid-June. It is divided into three terms. We do not rank our students or calculate grade point averages. For the duration of course work, student progress is internally assessed each term using pre-established, standards-based performance levels. Courses conclude with externally assessed examinations.

Co-curricular Activities

Our students are encouraged from early on in Senior School (Grade 6/Year 7) to initiate and participate in sports and extra-curricular activities (ECAs). Dulwich fields an incredibly competitive set of sports teams. We field 8 teams at the varsity level and 12 teams at the junior varsity level.

Nearly 90% of ECAs are student initiated and student-led. From Model United Nations (MUN) to the Duke of Edinburgh Awards to Masters in Technology (our own MIT) to the Dulwich Thrift Store and Sustainability 2020 Club, our students take ownership and stewardship of their clubs.
