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

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SCHOOL PROFILE 2019 / 2020

The Dulwich Network

Dulwich College (Singapore) belongs to a family of ten international schools in Asia that make up Dulwich College International who operate in partnership with Dulwich College, our founding school in London, under a World Charter. Dulwich College inspects Dulwich, Singapore (DCSG) annually. Close collaboration among our schools stimulates innovation and fosters an international mindset and outlook. We believe this community provides students with a unique advantage for the future where creativity is celebrated and inspiration is paramount.

Our School

Dulwich College (Singapore) opened in 2014 and educates children from age 2 to 18. Our school serves 2,462 students. There are 867 students in our Senior School, Years 7-13, 32 of which are in the first graduating class of 2020. The primary teaching language of DCSG is English. Up to age 5, students follow the Early Years Foundation Stage, and from Years 1 to 8, they follow the National Curriculum of England and Wales, which is enhanced to meet the needs of our international student body.

For Years 9 – 11 DCSG offers a 3-year IGCSE programme, which allows us to teach beyond the curriculum whilst giving us the flexibility to explore deeper and broader learning. It encourages greater understanding and knowledge. In addition, the programme provides Global Skills as a taught course and enrichment opportunities which culminate in the Dulwich Challenge Award, bronze silver and gold standards, modelled on the Duke of Edinburgh International Award.

School Calendar

The school year is 181 days, running from mid-August to mid-June. It is divided into three terms.

Co-curricular Activities

Our College offers over 100 different activities in addition to drama, arts and sports programmes, such as Model United Nations, Student Council, Green Gardeners' and the Duke of Edinburgh International Award. Service programmes support a host of local projects, ranging from working with the elderly to the delivery of food parcels for those in need. Internationally, DSCG works as part of the United World Schools programme, supporting a remote village school in Cambodia. Our Performing Arts programme performs internationally and has connections with The Royal Shakespeare Company, Vienna Boys Choir, Manchester College of Music and LAMDA. For sport, students compete in a wide variety of sports locally and internationally with other international schools within both Singapore and in Asia.

Grading

We do not rank our students or calculate grade point averages. For the duration of every course, student progress is internally assessed using pre-established, standards-based performance levels. Year 11 IGCSE courses and Year 13 IB conclude with externally assessed examinations.

Discipline Policy

Upon request, DCSG will report all external suspensions and withdrawals that arise as a result of a significant disciplinary incident or personal misconduct.

Academic Programmes

IGCSE – Years 9, 10 and 11.

Students take up to 11 individual examination subjects. All our students take Triple Award Science and are examined in each separate discipline. CAIE grades are on a scale of A* to G, and EDEXCEL's new grading scale is 9-1, with a letter grade of U / 1 indicating a failure to meet minimum standards, as regulated by OFQAL. A passing grade equivalent to a C on the new 9-1 scale is a 4, as indicated on the official website www.pearson.com Within this framework the students are offered an accelerated IGCSE Maths programme which is examined at the end of Year 10. The enhanced IGCSE programme prepares students for the rigours of the 2-year International Baccalaureate Programme in Years 12 and 13 (IBDP).

IB Diploma Programme - Years 12 and 13

All DCSG students start the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) in Year 12 in preparation for university. Our current Year 13 students, the graduating class of 2020, is the first cohort to complete the full 2-year IB Diploma programme within DCSG, hence we currently have no data of university destinations on our profile. Matriculation results representative of the 2019 Dulwich College International network of schools, offers a diverse distribution of destinations: 35% USA, 34%UK, 11% South Korea, 9% Europe, 4% Canada, 4% Hong Kong, 3% Other.
